Patrice Gates is an Atlanta, Georgia based artist who specializes in one of a kind drawings and paintings that are inspired by women and black culture. Born into a military family she often moved around as a child which allowed her to experience many different people and cultures. However, after her dad retired she made more permanent roots in her parents' hometown of Villa, Rica Georgia. A self-taught artist throughout grade school she later went to study art at the University of Louisville, Kentucky on a full-ride scholarship. It was during her final years of college that she discovered her love for painting. She graduated with a BA in Fine Arts and a minor in creative writing. After graduating Patrice moved back home. However, it wasn't until five years and many unfulfilling jobs later that she decided to pursue her art full-time.

As an artist, I strive to convey emotions and experiences through my chosen medium of oil, digital arts, acrylic and mixed media. My work often depicts women in simple moments (such as drinking coffee or putting on makeup) and by using vibrant colors to capture these moments and give them new life.

I draw inspiration from a variety of sources, including nature, music, black culture and the human experience. Through my art, I aim to create a sense of connection between my paintings and the viewer that gets them to see and appreciate the simplicity of the scenes and moments I paint but also enjoy the complexity of the painting, the work and thought that goes into each piece.

Ultimately, my goal as an artist is to evoke an emotional response and spark a conversation. Art has the power to inspire change and create a deeper sense of empathy and understanding in the world. With each piece I create, I hope to contribute to this ongoing conversation and inspire others to do the same.

“Love Where You Live” Heart Public Art Project Artist Agreement

This agreement (“Contract”) made the ____ day of _____, 2023, between the Cultural Arts Council Douglasville/ Douglas County (“CAC”), and _____ (“Artist”),

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Artist has been selected by CAC to design, execute, and deliver a piece of public art (hereinafter called “Heart Project”) that serves as a public piece of art.

WHEREAS, the Artist was selected via an open Call for Artists by an independent panel, with the CAC giving final approval; and

and WHEREAS, CAC and Artist have agreed Artist shall transfer ownership of design of said Heart Project to CAC;

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this agreement, the parties agree as follows:

1. Definitions

A finished Heart Project is the total design and completion of the fiberglass heart. The finished Heart Project includes the work, services and labor, and the goods and materials used to create the finished Heart Project.

2. Intent

2.1 The parties intend and agree that the Artist shall design and paint heart for CAC using approved design.

2.2 CAC shall provide the Artist with a prepped and primed fiberglass heart.

2.3 The Artist incurs all costs associated with design and painting of the fiberglass heart provided by the CAC.

2.4 The artist is to pick up the heart project from the CAC and paint it at their location. Finished heart projects must then be returned to the CAC. Any damage to the heart while in the artists possession will result in fees up to \$500 or repair costs.

3. Time Schedule & Painting

3.1 The Artist may begin painting as soon as the hearts are delivered.

3.2 Artist will coordinate all timetables with the CAC.

3.3 Artist agrees to paint with only materials from the paint and varnish list.

4. Promotion, Marketing, & Exhibition

4.1 Promotional materials: Artist shall provide the CAC at his/her expense information regarding the heart project not limited to a brief biography of the Artist, a Title for the finished art piece, and a summary of the inspiration behind the Heart Project. The Artist agrees to submit these promotional materials to the CAC at the time of transfer of finished Heart Project.

4.2 Artist grants CAC the perpetual right to photograph, film, use, and reproduce, as the CAC desires, photographs and videotapes taken during the creation of and the completed Heart Project in printed materials, displays, TV spots, in radio promotions, website design, and other promotional materials. CAC shall not represent the Artist or the Heart Project to the public in a questionable, undignified, or derogatory manner affecting the Artist’s standing in his/her profession.

4.3 The artist agrees to not release any information or photographs prior to the final debut of the project without prior permission. Once the project debuts, the artist agrees to give credit to the CAC for the project in any marketing or social media.

5. Commissions & Prizes

5.1 The Artist agrees to perform all work and services under this Agreement as an independent contractor and not as an agent or employee of CAC. CAC shall reserve the right to use the Artist’s name, promotional information supplied by Artist, and image of the Heart Project to publicize and promote CAC without compensation to the Artist.

6. Ownership of the Heart Project

The Heart Project is property of the CAC. Artist shall prepare, design, paint, and leave Heart Project to the CAC, with retaining ownership of finished Heart Project.

7. Alteration and/or Restoration

7.1 The Artist shall create the work in accordance with the proposed and approved design. Recognizing that the change in scale from submission sketch to full scale may require adjustments, the Artist has the right to make minor changes in the Heart Project design that are aesthetically necessary. Any change in design that significantly alters the original and approved concept and design of the Heart Project shall require the prior review and written approval of CAC.

7.2 CAC retains the right to alter, in any way, the Heart Project without the express written consent of the Artist.

8. Acceptance/Rejection of Heart Project

CAC reserves the right, in its reasonable discretion, to accept or reject the finished Heart Project. CAC reserves the right to reject a Heart Project for any reason, not limited to the use of subjects/themes that promote or glorify hatred, violence, racial, sexual, or religious intolerance, or promotes organizations with such views. The Heart Project subject/theme must be appropriate for all ages. Sexually or verbally explicit Heart Project shall be rejected at CAC’S discretion. In the event CAC finds the Heart Project unacceptable for any reason, CAC may request specific changes. The Artist reserves the right to refuse to

make changes per CAC request, and CAC shall reject the Heart Project. Any rejected Heart Projects will remain property of CAC, but artistic additions and imagery added by the Artist shall be removed by CAC.

9. Warranties

The Artist warrants and represents to CAC that the Heart Project is the original product of the Artist's own creative efforts, and the Heart Project design is unique and doesn't infringe upon any copyright.

10. Cancellation/Termination

10.1 This agreement may be terminated by either party by giving twenty (20) days written notice to the other party. In the event of cancellation or breach by the Artist, the Artist shall return any paint materials to CAC within thirty (30) days of default of contract.

11. Indemnification

Artist shall indemnify, keep and save harmless CAC, its agents, officials, employees, and consultants (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") against all injuries, death, loss, damages, claims, patent claims, suits, liabilities, judgments, cost and expenses, which may in any way accrue against any such Indemnified Party (collectively referred to as the "Loss") in consequence of this Contract, the granting or performance of it, or which may in any way result, whether or not it shall be alleged or determined that the Loss was caused through negligence or omission of Artist or his/her employees or volunteers, or of his/her Subcontractors or their employees or volunteers.

12. Assignment; Successors and Assigns

12.1 No part of this Contract shall be assigned or transferred without the prior written approval of the CAC.
12.2 This Contract shall bind the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

13. Additional General Terms and Conditions

13.1 Modifications: No modifications or changes to this Contract, or any part thereof, shall be valid unless in writing and signed by the parties, or their respective successors and assigns.
13.2 Severability: The invalidity of any one or more phrases, sentences, clauses or sections contained in this Agreement shall not affect the remaining portions of this Agreement or any part of it, and they shall remain in full force and effect subject to CAC's right to terminate.
13.3 Whole Agreement: This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and no inducements, considerations, and promises, or other references shall be implied or impressed upon this Contract that are not expressly addressed herein.
13.4 Effective Date: This Contract shall be effective on the date that it is executed by CAC.

In Witness Whereof, the parties hereto have executed this Agreement under seal the day and year first above written.

14. Acceptance of Terms

The signature of both parties shall evidence acceptance of these terms.
